The September monthly meeting was the annual Saitama 3 Y's Men's Clubs' joint meeting.

A joint meeting of the Saitama 3 Y's Men's Clubs (Saitama, Tokorozawa, and Kawagoe) was held at the Saitama YMCA Tokorozawa Centre with 28 participants. This joint meeting was the official visit of the Kanto Tobu District Governor, Mr. Masao Nagao, who was accompanied by District Secretary General, Mr. Kazuhiko Takada, Goshiro Yamamoto (Director-Elect) and the Membership Development Area Service Director, Kazuko Osawa.

The agenda was an AYC debriefing by Ms. Momoka Komi and Mr. Noritake Hishiyama from Rikkyo University YMCA, who participated in the August Asia-Pacific Youth Convocation (AYC) in Nepal. They both participated in the AYC because they were recommended by the Tokorozawa and Kawagoe clubs, respectively, and were supported by the Japan East Region, Kantotobu District, and their respective clubs. They reported that in Nepal, as well as the differences in food and culture, they had been stimulated in many ways by interacting with students from different countries in the Asia Pacific Area. It has been less than a month since they returned home, so it remains to be seen how and what they learned there will be used in the future. Still, they are both first-year students at Rikkyo University, and this valuable experience will gradually become more meaningful in their lives.

After the AYC debriefing, a dinner party was held in the Tokorozawa Centre with items brought in and purchased. There, the camp songs were sung under the leadership of Shunichiro Asaba, President of the Saitama Club, and Teruo Kinugasa, and Y's Lady Osawa led games. It was really a "YMCA and Y's Men's meeting," as DG Nagao and DS Takada commented.

Despite the flurry of activity at this joint meeting, the members of the Tokorozawa Club, including Masato Kotani, General Secretary of the Saitama YMCA, who provided the venue for the hall, and the members of the Tokorozawa Club did a lot of preparation and clean-up work. We would also like to thank all the other clubs who came from far away, the students of Rikkyo University who gave presentations, and everyone else who helped to make this meeting a successful event. Precisely to the Y's Men's belief "Let's serve the YMCA for the sake of the youth," I would like to promote the activities of YMCA and Y's Men's Clubs.

The total number of participants was 28.

Although it was a cloudy, hot, and humid day in October, we had a successful event with many visitors in the afternoon. The Asia-Pacific Area Convention is finally approaching.

The 30th Asia-Pacific Area Convention, which will take place over three days from 3 November, is now less than a month away. Currently, 175 participants from overseas and 340 from Hong Kong are expected, making the total number of participants in the Convention over 500. From Japan about 90 people from the Japan East and West Region have already registered. From the three Saitama clubs, a total of 11 people is scheduled to participate, including seven from the Kawagoe Club - President Yamamoto, Ms. Yoshida, Ms. Oikawa, me and my husband and my sister and her husband, Teruo Kinugasa from the Saitama Club, Kazuko Osawa from the Tokorozawa Club and two other members. Also, delegations will be sent not only from the Asia Pacific Area, but also from South Korea, India, and Africa. We are thankful to the many people who will participate.

The details of the event have also been announced. On Day 1 (3 November), there will be an opening

event at 5:30 pm, followed by a ceremony to install the Area President and the Area President-Elect, a dinner, and traditional cultural performances, including a lion dance. The second day is a full-day excursion, with dinner and a culture night from 6.30 pm on return, during which presentations from each region will be made. The Japan East Region offers a traditional lion dance by Mr. Masahiro Suzuki from the Tokyo Koto Club, so let's all get together to make it exciting. The final day, the 3rd day, will close with a report by the Area President, an AYC report, the IBC signing ceremony, and an appeal for the 2025 Kumamoto Convention, Japan.

As President of the Asia Pacific Area, I have already been in the position since 1 July, and it is a great honour for me to be solemnly installed once again in the presence of more than 500 participants at this convention.

I wish the Asia Pacific Area Convention a smooth and successful conclusion.

< Experience of living alone>


On 30 Sept (Sat) - 1 Oct (Sun), an "Experience of living alone" program was held for one night and two days in various rooms on the 4th floor of the Kawagoe Centre. One junior high and one high school student each participated in the program.

Before the program, some members stated that they did not want to live alone in the future, but after taking part in the program, their feelings changed to 'I want to live alone.' Living alone is actually a lot of hard work, but we hope this experience gave the participants a positive image. In addition, living alone requires the necessary skills for daily life (cooking, cleaning, laundry, money management, etc.), but learning these skills is difficult to do by oneself because of reluctance. For this reason, there was a lot to learn through this experience.

We would like to continue to provide opportunities to gain experience with peers and leaders at the YMCA.

Finally, we want to work together to help children of the future to become independent.
