From the International Stage “Keiko’s Monthly Briefing of YMI/ASP”

「Based on the teachings of Jesus Christ. . . .」

Y's Men's Clubs International is described in Article 2.1 of the International Constitution as "a worldwide friendship association of people of all faiths working together, united in mutual understanding and respect, based on the teachings of Jesus Christ." October 7th, 2023 is likely to be a day in world history. A massive military operation by Hamas took place from the Gaza Strip in Palestine, resulting in many deaths and kidnappings. And in retaliation, Israel bombed Gaza City badly as an expression of hatred and anger. Attacks from Israel are now escalating.

When faced with such world-historical events, we must be cautious. This is because there is a danger that our words and attitudes will be collected and used as "fuel for war." "Pouring oil on the fire" in this case is directly linked to an increase in casualties. However, to say nothing or to do nothing will only exacerbate the situation. In fact, each and every one of us is involved and trapped in this case - it is most important to recognize this situation as a fact.

We must then look at what is happening, talk about it and find out what we can do. Very importantly, this fight is connected to the "Russian-Ukrainian war." The ongoing war between Russia and Ukraine is perceived by Russia as a "special military operation to wipe out Nazism." And the memory of Nazism is behind Israel's continued horrific attacks that are impeached as 'outrageous' by the conscience of the world. We are now in the midst of a major event that is about to end the 20th century.

On top of this, it is important to bear in mind that this historical event has been "hijacked". There are "Jews" all over the world. These people are now frightened. This is because the military campaign being conducted by the Republic of Israel is extremely cruel. And on the other hand, about 20% of the citizens of the Republic of Israel are Arabs (i.e. Palestinians). Those people must be spending their days breathing in a vortex of immense hatred.

History-defining events always unfold based on the political decisions of "someone". And as if hijacked by that "someone", the people of the country or region are in turmoil. Whether it is the issue of "comfort women" or "Hiroshima and

Nagasaki", we are painfully aware that it has always been the same in our history.

In this context, the YMCA is invaluable." This is because it provides a direct channel to connect with "those who are being hijacked". There are YMCAs in Russia, Ukraine, Palestine, Israel and "between Israel and Palestine." At present, we are being hijacked, so of course we are very inconvenienced. But the channel remains. We can make use of it. I think the first step towards peace can only start from there. Since we have no freedom, we can only take very small, modest steps. But it is a solid step. It is a real step, different in dimension from jumping around in images.
