<u>Report on Rihito Kimura's lecture "If you're</u> <u>happy, clap your hands."</u>

Goshiro Yamamoto On Saturday, June 22, 2024, a lecture meeting of Mr. Rihito Kimura, "Birth Story of 'If you are happy, clap your hands" was held under the sponsorship of Kawagoe Y's Men's Club and co-sponsored by Saitama YMCA, Saitama Y's Men's Club and Tokorozawa Y's Men's Club. The venue was the "Child Rearing and Child Raising Center" of Saitama YMCA Tokorozawa Center, and many participants gathered for this excellent meeting.

I was familiar with the story of the birth of Mr. Kimura's "If you are happy, clap your hands" as I had heard it from Mr. Akira Futagoishi, former general secretary of Saitama YMCA since I participated in a work camp in the Philippines in 1994. It was broadcast on NHK-BS as a two-hour drama program. As a manga about it was published this year, I sent an e-mail to Mr. Kimura to ask him to speak about it again, and he graciously agreed.

Dr. Kimura was born in January 1934, and he told us about his background of being educated as a military boy and growing up with that thinking as the situation at that time. However, his uncle, who had studied in Germany, foresaw Japan's defeat in the war, and Japan lost the war in 1945. Later, while studying law, Dr. Kimura was encouraged by the Waseda Service to participate in a work camp in the Philippines, where he was told of the atrocities committed by the Japanese military. Of course, Filipinos' feelings toward the Japanese were horrible, and he was often bombarded with the words "Hapon Patai (Japanese, die)" wherever he went. He told us how he had such experiences through the Philippine Work Camp, but later returned to Japan and shared his various thoughts and feelings, and how the words of the Bible and Psalm 47 inspired him to write the famous song "If you are happy, clap your hands."

Dr. Kimura spoke about his experiences with laughter and vigor, which is hard to believe he is 90 years old, but it was indeed something that I would like young people to hear. I want to thank Dr. Rihito Kimura and the Saitama YMCA, Saitama Y's Men's Club, and Tokorozawa Y's Men's Club for this successful event.

My term as Asia Pacific Area President ends on June 30, 2024. Looking back on that term, I feel both joy and frustration that I did not do enough. It has been a journey with many challenges, but I am proud that I managed to accomplish my mission and foster growth. During my term, I had the opportunity to visit all the regions twice. However, I was only able to visit Taiwan once due to a scheduling conflict with the Japan East Regional Convention. These visits were a testament to my motto, "Shine and Empower through Fellowship." I am especially proud that two new clubs were formed in the Sri Lanka and Southeast Asia Regions, respectively, near the end of my term. These clubs are significant in that they were formed in two new cities, Kandy, Sri Lanka and Kathmandu, Nepal (there is a club in Kathmandu, but it is no longer active).

Additionally, I am thrilled that the three YMI centennial regional projects are not merely surviving but thriving. Songs from the Songfest Book are being used at various meetings worldwide. The solar panel project at the Makati YMCA is producing expected annual profits and the repayment of funds to the Area (a 4-year plan) appears to be on schedule. The e-Cookbook continues to be a great tool for exploring foreign recipes and providing a multicultural experience for our members.

As I complete my term as President, I am deeply grateful for the unwavering support and assistance of everyone in the Kawagoe Club.

My successor is Ms. Joan Wong from Hong Kong. I would like to assure you that with her leadership, the values and vision of our association will continue to be upheld. I ask for your continued understanding and cooperation in the management of our Area.

Charming Hsien, who was expected to be the first International President from Taiwan, suffered a stroke in April and is currently undergoing medical treatment.
